## Town of Wappinger unveils 'Wappinger Veterans Memorial Highway'

"Wappinger Heroes Weekend" was held on April 17 and 18. Town officials, Senator Sue Serino and Assemblyman Kieran Lalor unveiled new signs designating the portion of Route 9 in the Town of Wappinger as the "Wappinger Veterans Memorial Highway" on April 18. On April 17 the annual "Joseph Ennesser 5K Walk/Run" was held to raise funds for veterans organizations. The sign designation was the result of legislation sponsored and passed by Serino and Lalor in June 2020. It came after town officials and the Wappinger Veterans Advisory Committee pushed for the designation.

"Our veterans and active duty soldiers are a cornerstone to preserving and protecting our amazing Wappinger Community. During this past weekend our community, once again, came together to support our veterans with the Joe Ennesser 5K Walk/Run and the unveiling of the Wappinger Veterans Memorial Highway on Route 9. Thanks to our many volunteers, organizers, and sponsors, and especially to Kevin Hathorn, Randy Ross, Tommy Masch, and NY State Senator Sue Serino and NY State Assemblyman Kieran Lalor," said Town of Wappinger Supervisor Richard Thurston.

The "Wappinger Veterans Memorial Highway" signs will be placed on Route 9 South over the Wappinger Lake and Route 9 North on the border of the Town of Wappinger and Fishkill.

"This dedication is a great example of all that can be accomplished when our neighbors come together, and all levels of government work together, to support a great cause," said Serino in a release. "Words are hardly enough to express the depth of our gratitude to our vets for the sacrifices they have made for our country, and those they continue to make for our local community. By designating this portion of Route 9—the most traveled

stretch of road in the Town—the "Wappinger Veterans Memorial Highway," we hope to send a clear message to our veterans that they will forever have a grateful community behind them. We thank our servicemen and women for all that they have done, and all they continue to do for our country and our community each and every day."

"I had the honor of working with Senator Sue Serino and the Town of Wappinger on the bill to name a portion of Route 9 in honor of Wappinger veterans. We are so fortunate that many members of our community have served our nation and it is appropriate to see such a

## Howland Library vote set April 29

The Howland Public Library (HPL) will hold its 2021-22 budget vote and trustee election on Thursday, April 29. All registered voters in the Beacon City School District may vote between the hours of noon and 8 p.m. in the Community Room at the library. Absentee ballots must be returned by 5 p.m. on Thursday, April 29. Absentee ballots are available at the Howland Public Library, 313 Main St. and on its website at [beaconlibrary.org](http://beaconlibrary.org).

There are five candidates running for three trustee positions on the library's Board of Trustees. The two candidates that received the most votes will each be elected to a 5-year term. The candidate who received the third most votes will be elected to a 2-year term.

Kristen Salierno, HPL Director, remarked, "On the day of the vote we will have social distancing indicators in place and be limiting the number of people in the Community Room to four voters maximum at any time. We will also have a dedicated entry and exit to prevent cross traffic. We hope that our community members can feel safe in exercising their civic right to vote."

"The Board of Trustees and I continue to appreciate the investment our voters make each year to the library, and in turn, the community itself. The proposed budget increase this year is decreased from the last year. We worked very hard to arrive at a budget that will best allow us to serve the needs of the community while being mindful of the difficult times many of our patrons are facing financially," Salierno, said in an email sent out by the library.

"If the budget is passed it will allow Howland Library to expand a part time Librarian position into a full time position. This expansion will allow for continued growth of our technology education offerings, job search assistance, and classes that will help teach resume building skills. These areas continue to be vital needs of the community and our patrons. It will also allow for the growth of our soon to be debuted Library of Things and our e-book offerings," stated Salierno.

The state tax cap allowable levy growth factor is 1.0123 which would amount to an increase of \$14,445 to the annual tax levy, according to a library budget document.

According to the information regarding the budget, at its meeting held on Feb. 21, the Library Board voted to exceed the state tax cap and proposed a 4% increase in the tax levy, which is a \$46,976 increase. That is "the lowest proposed increase for the library budget since 2017,"

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## Police: Seven back porch fires at Fishkill complex being investigated

New York State Police responded with the Village of Fishkill Police Department and the Fishkill Fire Department to the Village at Merritt Park on Jefferson Boulevard in the Village of Fishkill for multiple structure fires on April 18. The investigation was still ongoing as of press time. All residents escaped with no injuries reported, according to state police.

The fires were set to seven rear back porches, according to state police. There were paper products being stored for recycling and set on fire in the 200 Building, 400 Building and 800 Building, according to a release from state police. There are 24 apartments in each building.

According to state police, the Fishkill Fire Department, with the assistance of multiple mutual aid departments, were able to successfully fight the fire. First responders moved residents to safety, according to police.



according to Salierno. The proposed tax levy, which is the amount to be raised by taxes, is \$1,221,376.

Total Building and Maintenance in 2020-21 was \$74,250, with a proposal of \$76,500 for 2021-22.

Regarding Materials and Programs, expenses, for '21-22 it is proposed \$102,725 from '20-21's \$101,055.

Total Personnel costs would go from \$974,728 in '20-21 to a proposed \$1,012,669 for '21-22. That includes salaries, salaries special for longevity,

FICA, SUI (State Unemployment Insurance) expenses, state disability insurance, Workers Comp insurance, health and dental insurance, Health Insurance Reimbursement and state retirement benefit fee, according to the information on the website about the budget.

Library income would go from \$1,242,583, in '20-21, to a proposed \$1,286,969, in '21-22. Income would come from the Library district tax, Beacon District/City PILOT (Payments in Lieu of Taxes) payments, Library

charges, donations, grants (NYS Source), interest income and transfer from fund balance. The transfer from fund balance is proposed to remain at \$30,000.

Regarding library usage, there have been 10,578 wireless sessions; 34,512 website visits; 4,456 internet sessions and 2,466 Reference questions.

Circulation was: Adult Print Items 30,002; Children's Print Items 27,859; Total Print Book Circulation 57,861; Electronic material 14,299; Other items circulation 28,864; System holds received

(number of items received from other libraries that were requested by patrons) 14,031 and Provided items 15,829.

The five candidates for trustee positions are:

Sam Anderson, Jan Dolan, Elaine Leinung, Sean Twohig and Phoebe Zinman. Dolan and Twohig currently serve as trustees on the board.

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## County COVID-19 update

# J&J vaccine pause explained

Dr. Anil Vaidian, commissioner of Dutchess County's Department of Behavioral & Community Health (DBCH) discussed the pause in administering Johnson & Johnson (J&J) vaccines last Wednesday during County Executive Marc Molinaro's Facebook Town Hall forum.

The pause, recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), is due to a rare type of blood clot experienced by a small number of women who received the J&J vaccine.

"This should reassure individuals that the FDA and CDC hold these vaccines as a very important priority," Dr. Vaidian said, adding that the public should "put things in perspective"; out of a total of nearly seven million Americans receiving the vaccine, there have been six known cases of this very serious side effect.

"It's literally a one-in-a-million occurrence," he said, "but the FDA and the CDC felt that out of an abundance of caution, they needed to review the literature, review the data and make recommendations."

All six of the reported cases have been in women ages 18-48 occurring 6-13 days after vaccination; but anyone who received the J&J vaccine is urged to seek

medical care if they develop any of the following symptoms: severe headache, backache, new neurologic symptoms, severe abdominal pain, shortness of breath, leg swelling, tiny red spots on the skin (petechiae) or new or easy bruising.

Viewing the pause in a positive light, Dr. Vaidian said it helps raise public awareness of this rare side effect, so that anyone experiencing the symptoms can consult their healthcare provider. In addition, it alerts the medical community to look out for these symptoms and to understand this type of blood clot - known as a cerebral venous sinus thrombosis (CVST) - needs to be treated differently than "normal" blood clots - for example, no blood thinners should be prescribed, because the CVST was seen in combination with low levels of blood platelets, according to the CDC.

The CDC noted that CVSTs have not been reported with either Pfizer or Moderna vaccines.

### Infection rate continues to plateau; vaccines up

Molinaro noted that the county's infection rate has been "stuck" at about 4 percent for some time.

"It's been very stubborn," he said, but added that this number is imperfect, because it signifies the number of positive tests on a given day divided by the total number of tests conducted on that day.

"We don't get back the test results uniformly," said Molinaro, which is why the seven-day rolling average is an important metric.

As always, he continued to urge residents to follow the recommended mitigation steps as more and more of the population gets vaccinated.

As of Friday, April 16, nearly 43 percent of Dutchess residents had received at least one vaccine dose, and 27 percent had completed their series. With the J&J vaccine on pause, the county's pop-up clinics are on hold; vaccines will continue to be administered at the county's two fixed POD sites in Poughkeepsie and Dover.

In total, the county and its partners received 4,300 first and second doses last week.

The county reminds residents that additional vaccine doses are available at New York State-run sites, which includes SUNY Orange in Middletown and the Ulster County Fairgrounds in New Paltz. Some other locations in the county, such as CVS, Tops Pharmacy and others, are receiving doses from the federal government; residents can use the CDC's Vaccine Finder (<https://vaccinefinder.org/>) for information about these locations.

Molinaro said any county resident age 60 and older who still needs access to a vaccine can call the Dutchess County Office for the Aging at (845) 486-2555

and they will set up an appointment.

### College students asked to be 'ambassadors'

Molinaro was asked to comment on the recent off-campus party associated with Marist College students, which included a law-enforcement response.

Addressing students, he said, "You're ambassadors and representatives of your family, yourselves and the college you're attending. The colleges have asked you to be the best ambassadors you can be."

He also noted that it's not helpful to divert law enforcement from potentially more serious work.

The county executive said he commended Marist officials because "they take these things seriously, and will take the appropriate response."

"We understand that people want to blow off steam," Molinaro said. "That is not the way to do it."

Dr. Vaidian said, "Since the very beginning, we coordinated with the colleges. They have done a wonderful job in controlling COVID. Periodically we have seen clusters of cases, but we have not seen spillover into the community."

He added that DBCH is following cases in the Marist community, which have exceeded 600, according to the college's COVID-19 dashboard (<https://www.marist.edu/reopen/dashboard>).

# 35K vaccine doses allotted for college students

- New York State will provide a dedicated initial allocation of 35,000 vaccine doses to address the college student population at SUNY schools and private colleges. These direct allocations will allow these institutions to vaccinate thousands of students before the school year ends.

- The State Department of Health issued guidance to allow graduation and commencement ceremonies to take place with limited capacity. Effective May 1, indoor and outdoor graduation and commencement ceremonies will be allowed with limited capacity, depending on the event size and the location (e.g., stadium, arena, arts and entertainment venue). Additional safety protocols must be in place.

- Last week, the state launched a new tar-

geted initiative to bring the vaccine to farmers and food producers. This new effort will bring pop-up vaccination sites directly to farms and food production facilities.

- While the Johnson & Johnson vaccine is paused, New York is using the Pfizer vaccine in order to meet and maintain scheduled appointments at state-run sites.

- Spectators will be allowed at horse and auto races at 20-percent capacity beginning Thursday, April 22. Spectators will be subjected to the state's strict guidance, which is currently in effect for other professional sports competitions with fans. Attendees must show proof of a recent negative test or completed vaccination series prior to entry and are subjected to the state's health and safety protocols on face coverings, social distancing and

health screening.

- "To-go" alcoholic beverages have been extended through May 6. Throughout the pandemic the State has permitted to-go alcoholic beverages with the purchase of food to help support bars and restaurants.

- Become a New York State Citizen Public Health Leader. To continue the fight against COVID and prepare for the next public health emergency, the state launched the free, online Citizen Public Health Training course for New Yorkers, in partnership with Cornell University and supported by the State University of New York. This program will prepare and equip New Yorkers to become Citizen Public Health Leaders and build an informed network across the state. - Last week, Gov. Andrew Cuomo signed legislation that will ensure low-income families have access to high-speed internet. The legislation requires

that internet service providers offer high-speed internet plans to low-income customers for \$15 per month.

## Marist re-opens campus, but halts 'high-risk' sports

After a lengthy three-week pause due to an outbreak on campus of COVID-19, Marist College re-opened last Monday with in-person classes and dining halls.

But not all of its student-athletes are back on the playing fields.

The college is implementing various initiatives as part of a pilot program to re-open campus activity. That includes sending "high-risk," close-contact sports to the sidelines, including men's and women's lacrosse, track and field, and crew.

Men's and women's tennis, baseball and softball, which are considered low-risk

sports, began competition over the weekend.

All members of the programs must continue to follow all of the mitigating factors, including mask usage and social distancing.

The McCann Fitness Center (second floor) re-opened Friday, April 16, with a 25-percent capacity limit.

At this time, in accordance with college and local guidelines, there will be no spectators at home Marist College Athletics events.

The college will continue to evaluate the data regarding the pilot approach on a daily basis. Discussions will continue on safe ways to return to training, practice, and competition for all sports.

remarked in the release, "Thankfully no one was injured. What would motivate someone to do this is unclear at this time, but we will be working tirelessly to find out who did this and why. The community can expect to see a higher police presence in the area."

"Carmel played a great game and executed their game plan well," Patriots coach Tom O'Hare said. "They made the plays."

## Watson announces re-election bid for Family Court Judge

Earlier this month, Denise M. Watson, Dutchess County Family Court Judge and Acting Supreme Court Justice announced she is officially running for re-election to the Family Court bench. Judge Watson has served as Family Court Judge since her election in 2011. She was appointed as Acting Supreme Court Justice in 2013 and has presided over the Dutchess County Family Drug Treatment Court and Youth Drug Treatment Court which are problem solving courts assisting parents struggling with substance use issues, to become sober in a supportive environment and works towards reunifying their families.

In announcing her candidacy for re-election, Watson said "I have been honored to serve my fellow residents of Dutchess County and believe that the work we do in Family Court is crucial to protect the interests of all members of our community, especially our children. I pledge to continue to work hard every day, to listen carefully, to be patient, and to handle with respect the individuals who appear in the difficult cases that are presented in Family Court."

A Dutchess County native who graduated from Our Lady of Lourdes High School in Poughkeepsie, Watson received her Bachelor of Arts degree from Boston College and graduated from St. Louis University School of Law in 1982.

Judge Watson has been working in Family Court for over twenty years, having started in 1999 as Principal Court Attorney to the Hon. Peter M. Forman. She has also served on several committees over the years that involve Family Court practices and personnel such as the state wide Partnership for Family Recovery, the Dutchess County Child Welfare Improvement Project for Abused and Neglected Children, the Dutchess County Juvenile Detention Task

Force, the Dutchess County Court Involved Youth Committee, the Dutchess County Sex Offender Management Committee, the Dutchess County Juvenile Justice Victim Offender Mediation Committee and the Dutchess County Police Reform & Modernization Collaborative.

Family Court handles cases involving custody, visitation, guardianship, child support, child abuse and neglect, juvenile delinquency, PINS (Persons in Need of Supervision), family offense and adoption proceedings. There are three other judges that serve on the bench with Watson in Dutchess County. Hon. Joseph A. Egitto, Hon. Tracy C. MacKenzie and Hon. Jeffrey C. Martin.

Watson, 64, has been married 40 years to Patrick J. Watson and has four children, James, Cal, Sarah and Matthew and twin grandsons. She has been involved in various community committees over the years, currently serving as a board member of the Alumni Association of Our Lady of Lourdes High School. She has served as a past board member at the Catharine Street Community Center; the Catholic Schools Network, Dutchess and Ulster County; admissions recruiter for Boston College; past Vice President and Council Member of the Parish Council at Holy Trinity Church; past Co-leader, Girl Scouts, Troop 83, Dutchess County and past Troop Advisor, Law/Government Explorer's Post, Dutchess County Boy Scouts. She has also served in the past as a board member of the Mid-Hudson Children's Museum and the Mid-Hudson Library Association.

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Notes from the Town of Wappinger Supervisor

Update on town's water supply

Since taking office in January 2018, I and two Town Boards focused on remediating and expanding Town water services. Water is at the core of our quality of life. Therefore, expanding/protecting our water sources to ensure a more dependable and reliable water supply has been one of our top priorities, and successfully implemented:

Wappinger has 17.62 miles of shoreline along our boundaries (Hudson River, Wappinger Creek, and Sprout Creek);

Three drainage basins exist: Wappinger Creek; Fishkill Creek (the Sprout Creek is a tributary); and the Hudson River. Nearly 4,000 acres of Town lands (25% of our total acreage) are located within 100 year floodplains. Additionally, many acres of protected wetlands are found throughout the Town.

Eight separate private water systems once operated within the Town (Central, Oakwood, Fleetwood, Tall Trees, Ardmore, Watch Hill, Wappinger Park, and North Wappinger). All, except for Fleetwood, have been consolidated into the United Wappinger Water District (UWWD). Watch Hill receives its water from the Town of Fishkill.

The UWWD serves 10,000 people (but, 13,000 residents still remain on well water). UWWD delivers an average of 1 to 2 million gallons of water per day. The water is sourced, pumped, filtered, and disinfected before being pumped to our storage tanks (capacity of 1.6 million gallons) at Hill Top.

In January 2018, the Town operated only the Atlas wellfield. Two different Boards and I funded expansion to three wellfields:

1. Atlas: our primary water source.

Located along the Wappinger Creek, west of the Dutchess County Airport.

Four working wells exist, and a fifth is planned to be repaired.

Output = 1100 gallons per minute ("gpm") or 1.5 million gallons per day (mgd").

2. Hilltop: main backup to Atlas.

Located along the Sprout Creek, SE of Deer Run Drive.

The Hilltop wellfield had 4 poorly functioning wells. For the last ten years, wells #1 and #2 have been unusable, and well #3 has been extremely limited.

Because of the increasingly deteriorating conditions, output had dropped to less than 300 gpm or 400,000 gpd, at best.

We have just replaced wells #1, 2, and 3 which will yield 750 gpm (1.0 mgd), and, together with well #5, the combined output will exceed 800gpm (1.2+ mgd). (Wellfield output may be affected during droughts).

3. Meadowood: secondary backup.

Located along the Sprout Creek, north of Old Hopewell Road.

Built approximately 20 years ago, but never put into service and therefore deteriorated beyond use.

The Town Board approved this capital project in 2019: we now have two filtered

wells which deliver a total of 200 gpm or 300,000 gpd. (Wellfield output may be affected during droughts).

The 2019-20 Hilltop/Meadowood capital projects have increased potential usable output by 950 gpm or 1.4 mgd. Our current municipal demand is an average daily flow of 1.0 mgd with a peak day of 1.7+ mgd. Total output availability of the three wellfields is now 2,100 gpm or 3.10 mgd.

The storage capacity of our two tanks located at Cider Mill Loop is 1.7 million gallons. We are now considering the construction of a third storage tank because the lack of storage capacity is a limiting factor in terms of excess capacity at the UWWD.

The three wellfields bless the Town of Wappinger with ample supplies of high quality water. However, we face several challenges to future municipal water services, which challenges and current efforts to address them will be discussed in a future column:

Aquifer protection. Protection of our primary/principal aquifers including backup supplies.

Aging infrastructure. Certain of the Town's municipal water lines and equipment were installed in the 1960's. A major water main was installed in recent years (thanks to Barbara Gutzler) - running along New Hamburg/Wheeler Hill Roads (paid for by the New York City Department of Environmental Protection ("DEP") to service initially the

Delaware Aqueduct bypass tunnel being constructed 700' under the Hudson River, and which emerges in our Town).

We have received, and are now applying for, grant monies for further expansion.

Availability of municipal services. Over 1/2 of the Town's population is not on municipal water. Instead, those residents and businesses depend on private wells, some of which are becoming unusable. Expanding services to supply more water to our community is now being planned, along with sewer capacity expansion.

# Vassar College names Cultural Center Building for former professor Jeh Vincent Johnson

Vassar College's ALANA Center, which provides resources and programs for students of color, will be named for Professor Jeh Vincent Johnson, the pioneering African American architect and former Vassar faculty member who designed it. President Elizabeth H. Bradley made the announcement as part of last weekend's African American Alumnae/i of Vassar College (AAAVC) Triennial, which celebrates the contributions of African American alumnae/i, students, faculty, administrators, and staff of Vassar College. Johnson died in January.

"Throughout his nearly four decades at Vassar, Professor Johnson had enormous impact on our campus, the field of architecture, and even national policy," Bradley said. "He loved Vassar deeply, and with the renaming of the building as the Jeh Vincent Johnson ALANA Cultural Center, we can demonstrate how deeply Vassar loved him in return."

Alumnae Paula Madison '74, Lucey Bowen '68, and Karen Clopton '80 have collectively pledged a \$125,000, one-to-one matching gift to fund updates and enhancements over the next year, including a newly envisioned entrance, new furniture, and other improvements. A naming ceremony will follow completion of the work in fall 2022.

The Jeh Vincent Johnson ALANA Cultural Center, which opened in 1993, was one of several buildings on campus that Johnson designed, and will be the first building on Vassar's campus named

for an African American, President Bradley noted.

"There was unanimous support for this initiative from members of the Board of Trustees, who felt that Professor Johnson's contributions to the creation and building of the Center and his very presence were foundational to the College's effort to create a more welcoming space for people of color on campus," said Board Chair Anthony Friscia '78.

The Jeh Vincent Johnson ALANA Cultural Center is one stop on a tour of historic buildings that is part of Buildings and Belonging: Mapping the African American Experience at Vassar College since 1861, a project that recognizes the contributions of African Americans at Vassar throughout the College's history with building markers.

Clopton, who envisioned the Buildings and Belonging project said, "Professor Johnson was inspirational, gracious, and most generous with his time, knowledge, and wisdom."

Johnson was born in Nashville, TN in 1931 and came north to attend Columbia University, graduating from both Columbia College and the university's School of Architecture as class valedictorian. In 1963, he moved to Dutchess County to start an architectural firm with a Columbia classmate and began his part-time teaching position at Vassar shortly thereafter. His father, Charles S. Johnson was President of Fisk University, and his son, Jeh Charles Johnson, was Secretary

of Homeland Security Under President Obama from 2013 to 2017.

In 1967, President Lyndon Johnson appointed him to serve on the National Commission on Urban Problems. He chaired the National Committee on Housing for the American Institute of Architects (AIA) and was awarded a special citation from the AIA's New York chapter for his

advocacy of equal opportunity in the field, his pioneering work on housing issues, and his commitment to maintaining the cultural integrity and social responsibility of the profession of architecture.

"I've always been inspired by the power of the Art & Soul Gala to bring together a community of people passionate about improving healthcare accessibility in Chermaitre and surrounding areas," Gollerkeri said. "It has been a daunting task to re-imagine this event in a virtual space, but we are driven by the knowledge of the incredible impact the clinic will have in the coming year, and are excited by the opportunity to inspire an even larger audience to join in our mission."

The annual gala, supported by physicians and businesses from throughout the Hudson Valley, provides funding for a medical clinic in Haiti that is also financed through the sale of Haitian art and crafts. Elizabeth H. Bradley PhD has served as president of Vassar College since July 2017. In that time, she has led the college to establish new programs and partnerships in India, Rwanda, and China to bring the model of liberal arts higher education to these settings. In addition, Bradley has collaborated with Columbia University creating a five-year BA-MPH program for Vassar students. Bradley has most recently served on Governor Cuomo's NY Forward Re-Opening Advisory Committee and helped draft the guidelines for NY higher education re-opening in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic.

"This year we are also absolutely thrilled that two of Haiti's most famous native sons, Grammy Award winning music producer Jerry Wonda, and world renowned rapper and hip hop artist Wyclef Jean of the Fugees will be giving a special performance for our event!" said Dr. David Cho, chair of the Medical Advisory Board which is a group of local physicians.

Wyclef Jean was born in Haiti in 1969 and immigrated to the United States nine years later. He achieved fame with the New Jersey hip hop group the Fugees and raised relief funds for victims of a devastating earthquake in Haiti in 2010.

Jerry Wonda, who was the Fugees' producer and also its bass guitar player, has been a producer for numerous artists, including LL Cool J, Mary J. Blige, Shakira, Whitney Houston, Jennifer Hudson and Lionel Richie.

**Escarole Pie**

**Ingredients**  
**For the escarole:**

2 large heads of escarole washed. Wash

it right before you cook it.

- 20 raisins
- 15 black olives
- 15-20 pignoli nuts
- Pinch salt
- Pinch pepper
- 5 cloves garlic, diced fine
- 1/4 cup olive oil

**For the pie dough:**

- 1 3/4 lb. all purpose flour
- 1 1/2 cup water
- 2 tbsps. olive oil
- 1 pinch baking powder
- 1 pinch salt
- 1 pinch sugar

**Method:**

In a bowl, place all the dry ingredients for the pie crust. Add the water and mix by hand till the dough comes together. Make it into 2 balls and set aside.

In a large pot, add the olive oil and garlic. Cook on high heat until brown and reduce the heat to medium.

Add escarole and cover. After a few minutes, add remaining ingredients and let simmer on low heat for 20 minutes or until the escarole is tender.

Roll out a dough ball till it is round and flat. Get a large frying pan (one that can be placed in the oven) and coat the

bottom generously with olive oil. Place the dough into the pan, allowing the sides to hang outside the pan.

Add the escarole.

Roll out the other dough ball and lay on top of the escarole.

Roll together the bottom dough and the top dough to form a ring around frying pan. Coat the top of the pie dough with olive oil.

Place the pan on medium heat and "fry" the bottom for about 10 minutes.

Place the pan in the oven at 350 degrees and bake for 30 minutes or until the top of the pie is golden brown.

Remove and let rest for 30 minutes. Can be served hot or cold. Cold is better.

Because of the rich flavors, this goes great with red wine.

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**Appendix "A" to Dutchess County Water and Wastewater Authority Sewer Rules and Regulations Special Rules and Regulations Part County Sewer District No. 9 Obercreek Farm Community Wastewater System**

I. Scope  
These Special Rules and Regulations are in addition to the Dutchess County Sewer Rules and Regulations and are applicable only to Part County Sewer District No. 9 Obercreek Farm Community Wastewater System.

II. Rules and Regulations

A. Permit

1. Prior to any installation, the property owner (hereafter "Owner") must obtain a permit from DCWWA for the connection to the public sewer. Owner shall pay permit fee per established fee schedule.

2. Prior to permit approval, the Owner is responsible to submit for DCWWA approval the following prepared by a Licensed Professional Engineer currently registered to practice in New York State:

a. a. Design Standards – Unless otherwise modified herein, the design shall conform to the requirements of the Dutchess County Department of Behavioral and Community Health Design and Construction Standards (2016 or as subsequently revised) and the New York State Department of Health Appendix 75A (2016 or as subsequently revised) and with Chapters 5 and 6 of the New York State Department of Health Residential Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems Design Handbook (2012 or as subsequently revised.)  
b. A site plan locating the residence, the septic tank, the discharge line, connection point to the public sewer and access to the septic tank for inspection and cleaning.  
c. Calculations determining the required capacity of the septic tank – shall conform to the requirements of the Dutchess County Department of Behavioral and Community Health Design and Construction Standards (2016 or as subsequently revised) and with Table 3 of the above referenced NYS DOH Design Handbook.

d. Technical data on the construction and installation of the septic tank, any required lift station, source of power supply to lift sta-

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tion and piping materials. e. Installation must be certified as having been installed in accordance with the approved documents by the same Licensed Professional Engineer as performed the design.

**Appendix "A" to Dutchess County Water and Wastewater Authority Sewer Rules and Regulations Special Rules and Regulations Part County Sewer District No. 9 Obercreek Farm Community Wastewater System**

3. No discharge to the public sewer will be allowed until all permit conditions have been met.

4. Issuance of a permit for service grants to DCWWA and its employees, agents and contractors the right of access to the property for inspection and service of the septic tank and further grants access to the residence to determine that non-conforming use, improper installation or any other violation of the Rules and Regulations in regard to permit are not occurring.

B. Connected Items  
1. Sanitary wastes from any agricultural, commercial or industrial operations including food processing or preparation and laundries will not be accepted into the system.

2. Only plumbing fixtures acceptable to the Plumbing and Energy Conservation Codes of New York State are allowed  
3. Only residential style dish washers, clothes washers and other appliances with sanitary waste may be connected to sanitary waste system.

4. Discharges from roof, foundation and storm drainage are not allowed to be discharged to the septic tank nor the discharge line from the septic tank.

5. Back wash from such items as swimming pool filters, domestic water filters and water treatment/conditioning equipment shall not be connected to the sanitary waste system.

C. Installation Requirements

1. Septic tanks  
a. Must be located such to minimize the distance between the septic tank and the public sewer.

b. Must be no farther than 50' from a public road or private road or drive capable of supporting a standard vacuum septic tank cleaning truck.

c. All septic tanks will consist of two compartments with the

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first compartment of approximately 2/3 the volume of the total tank volume required by regulation for residences with garbage disposals.

d. All septic tank inspection/cleaning ports shall be extended to the surface with a removable cap of no less than 24" in diameter weighing less than 40 pounds.

**Appendix "A" to Dutchess County Water and Wastewater Authority Sewer Rules and Regulations Special Rules and Regulations Part County Sewer District No. 9 Obercreek Farm Community Wastewater System**

2. Piping  
a. Gravity Service Lines - Gravity service lines between the septic tank and the public sewer shall be Schedule 40 PVC and installed per DCWWA Standards and Details.

b. Pressurized Service Lines – Pressurized service lines shall be Schedule 80 PVC and must transition to gravity flow prior to connecting with the public sewer. Installation shall be per DCWWA Standards and Details.  
D. Ownership  
1. The Owner owns the septic tank, any lift station and piping to the point of connection to the public sewer.  
2. Where individual lift stations are required, the property Owner owns the lift station, the electrical supply to lift station, and any backup power source that may be required by regulation or authority having jurisdiction.

E. Maintenance and Repair  
1. The Owner is responsible to maintain and repair the septic tank, including the obligation to timely pump out the tank as needed from time to time. The Owner is also responsible to maintain and repair any lift station, electrical or backup electrical supply system associated with the treating and discharge of sanitary waste to the public sewers.  
2. The Owner shall maintain the septic tank structure and access holes in good repair and accessibility.  
3. For the purpose of protecting its downstream infrastructure, DCWWA will monitor the levels of liquid and sludge within the Owner's septic tank and notify the Owner to clean the septic tank as necessary to assure proper septic tank operation and subsurface disposal field operation.  
4. When DCWWA de-
