Job Summary: The Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse is seeking a Licensed Clinical Social Worker to join our team as a Trauma Therapist. The Trauma Therapist will provide trauma therapy to child victims of abuse, as well as non-offending caregivers.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Provide trauma-informed treatment to victims of abuse and their family members/caregivers.
- Conduct assessments using standardized measures, treatment planning, completing intakes and maintaining accurate and current case records.
- Facilitate supportive and educational groups for victims' families and the community.
- Work as part of a multi-disciplinary team which includes participation in monthly team meetings and coordinating treatment and on-going collaboration with community agencies.
- Recording statistical demographic information for national data base and grant reporting via computer.
- Provide clinical expertise and perspective to the work of the agency.
