Largest onsemi facility now located in East Fishkill

A ribbon-cutting ceremony took place in East Fishkill touting onsemi (ON Semiconductor) acquiring Global Foundries' (GF) 300 mm fabrication facility, certain intellectual property and the site in East Fishkill, off of Route 52. The acquisition was effective Dec. 31, 2022.

"I think today is very, very exciting. The Town is hopeful in more investment in the County," said Nicholas D'Alessandro, East Fishkill Town Supervisor, before the morning ceremony began on February 10.

This acquisition now makes the facility in East Fishkill onsemi's largest manufacturing site in America.

"The transaction includes an exclusive commitment to supply GF with differentiat-

ed semiconductor solutions and invest in research & development as both companies collaborate to build on future growth," according to information from onsemi.

"The local facility contributes to the community by retaining more than 1,000 jobs. With the recent passage of the Federal CHIPS and Science Act as well as the New York Green CHIPS Program, onsemi will continue to evaluate opportunities for expansion and growth in East Fishkill and its contribution to the surrounding community," stated onsemi officials.

U.S. Senate Majority Leader Charles Schumer said "it is official."

"The acquisition of this facility by onsemi from GlobalFoundries has been a

long journey," he said.

According to onsemi's announcement, the company put in work over the past three years, "specifically focusing on securing a long-term future for the [East Fishkill] facility and its employees, making significant investments in its 300mm capabilities to accelerate growth in the company's power, analog and sensing products, and enabling an improved manufacturing cost structure."

A group of employees watched the ceremony and announcement. Schumer stated that their "jobs are safe" and noted "we're looking to the future here."

Schumer remarked, "This is the jolt of electricity that the Hudson Valley needs."

Celebrating 25 years of 'Freezin' for a Reason'

Take part in "Freezin' for a Reason" Polar Plunge in Fishkill on February 18 and celebrate the 25th year of this local event that raises funds for the athletes of Special Olympics NY.

Organizers suggest all teams and individuals schedule a time to arrive at Sharpe Reservation, at 436 Van Wyck Lake Road, Fishkill and take the plunge.

"It is going to be exciting! We are celebrating our 25th Anniversary this year. Retired officer Chris Hamel started this local event 25 years ago with 18 participants raising a couple of thousand dollars. Now the event has over 400 participants who raised over \$220,000 in 2022," said Teresa Gilli, Director of Development, Special Olympics NY.

Gilli remarked, "Today, Chris is still our Chair for the Plunge and along with his family continues to make this event a success." Gilli said she and Hamel "are both so appreciative to our community. We are heart-felt for the love all have shown through the years. The love of our athletes is just priceless! We know we will see and are seeing again this year. We cannot wait!"

Hamel recalled during a recent phone interview that a Special Olympics athlete dared him to participate in the Polar Plunge while he was in Alaska. That is when he had the idea to bring the Polar Plunge to the Hudson Valley.

Hamel said he could not have done the Polar Plunge event every year without the support of his family and Special Olympics NY.

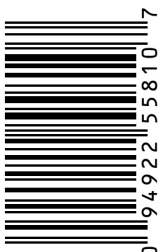
"This year is dedicated to Neal Johnson, former Special Olympics NY CEO," said Hamel. Hamel said Johnson's mission and drive, along with his own mission and drive, enabled the Fishkill Polar Plunge to get to where it is today.

The goal that organizers are aiming to reach this year is \$250,000. The funds go to support the Athletes of Special Olympics NY in the Hudson Valley Region.

"We are seeking brave souls this year to help us make this happen. The \$250,000 will sponsor 500 athletes in

He showed a wafer that is made on the site. He later signed one with a congratulatory message.

Hassane El-Khoury, who is the CEO of onsemi, said during his remarks, the company has five different plants in America. He said of the East Fishkill plant, "It's not only the largest, it's also the most advanced for us."

The facility is "going to bring in the technology of the future," said El-Khoury.

Stance Mason is the head for logistics at the East Fishkill site. He is a resident of Wappingers Falls who was born in Mount Vernon in Westchester County and raised in Mount Vernon and the Bronx.

Mason said it is the team at onsemi and his wife who made this possible for him. He said he is excited.

"That's what's possible. He's (Mason) as example of what's possible" at onsemi, said El-Khoury.

J.D. Grom, Senior Advisor to the Commerce Secretary for CHIPS Implementation, said the current administration is "committed to revitalizing American manufacturing."

Schumer noted that IBM first opened its East Fishkill campus in 1963. In 2014, IBM sold its 300mm chip fab in East Fishkill to GlobalFoundries. In April of 2019, according to Schuler's office, GlobalFoundries announced it would sell the plant to onsemi.

The company information states it has "a focus on automotive and industrial end-markets, the company is accelerating change in megatrends such as vehicle electrification and safety, sustainable energy grids, industrial automation, and 5G and cloud infrastructure."

Asked what having this announcement by onsemi today said to other businesses, D'Alessandro replied, "This shows specialized chip manufacturing and that we have the skilled labor force that businesses need to continue their business and expand their business."

Kimlin Cider Mill open house February 20 in Poughkeepsie

"The group formed in 2000 when developers purchased 18 acres of farmland owned by the Kimlin family, including the land on which the Kimlin Cider Mill sat, and proposed to develop a residential subdivision, including the demolition of the cider mill local landmark. Seeing the importance of the cider mill in the history and future of the town, local

residents joined together as the Cider Mill Friends (CMF)."

The Cider Mill is on the National and State Registers of Historic Places, said Ann Shershin, who pointed out the plaque on the outside of the building. It reads: "Kimlin Cider Mill Cedar Avenue Poughkeepsie, New York, has been placed on the National Register of Historic Places by the United States Department of the Interior, February 13,

2003." It was noted that the Mill is also on the Town of Poughkeepsie Historic Landmark. Shershin is with the nonprofit and Poughkeepsie Town Board.

According to the website, "In 2001, CMF and Cider Mill Development LLC signed a letter agreement that stated CMF would have the opportunity to purchase the cider mill and surrounding land. CMF assembled funds from local donors for the down payment, but when they moved to purchase the cider mill, the developers reneged. CMF battled in the courtroom until finally winning the case and purchasing the cider mill seven years later in 2008."

Attendees can see the press where the process of making cider took place. "They were reasonably successful," noted Weiss.

Stephanie LaRose Lewison, board member of Cider Mill Friends, said via email, "[M]any years ago, I found myself

passing this big, large barn building often and wondered what it was. I finally found out that it was a historic cider mill being renovated by a small nonprofit organization that needed volunteers. So, I volunteered and 12 years later I am still volunteering (and currently serving on the board) because I think it is a worthy cause that is preserving a unique piece of Poughkeepsie history."

There was a Vassar College and Cider Mill connection, said Weiss. Photos from the 1950s show Vassar College students sitting in front of the fireplace enjoying a fire. Weiss said the college students, to get exercise, would walk from Vassar down to the Mill. There was a café Room, which was the public space, said Weiss.

The location also had a Museum room. "It's so interesting... it's a great story," said Shershin.

Should tax increases be celebrated as fiscally responsible?

To the Editor:

When is an 8% tax increase celebrated as being fiscally responsible? Apparently, the Town of Wappinger has found a way. The Tax Levy increase from 2022 to 2023 in the "Town Outside Tax" is 8% and the increase for 2021 to 2022 is 5.8%. Property owners, please check your tax bill where you will see these numbers clearly stated in the third column from the left.

When I made an inquiry to the NY State Comptroller's office, the explanation is "the Property Tax Cap gets applied to the aggregate of all the Town's tax levies, not to each individual tax levy."

So, in 2023, the Town Outside Village tax levy increased from 5,993,280 to 6,471,731 (increase of \$478,450), but that increase was more than offset by a decrease in the Water District tax levy from 1,469,907 to 932,730 (decrease of 537,177). In aggregate, the Town actually decreased the total levy from 2022 to 2023 by about \$37,000 from \$8,717,565 to \$8,680,877.

What is missing from this analysis is that approximately two-thirds of the town residents live outside a Town Water District... so our responsibilities for the Tax Levy have increased above the 2% cap for the past two years.

So yes, our Town Supervisor and Town Board can congratulate themselves on how fiscally responsible they are. But for the majority of residents, our tax levy responsibility has increased far above the 2% tax cap.

I would like to show my appreciation to all of our Wappinger Town and Wappingers Falls Village residents who have reached out to me with their well wishes and support as I begin my campaign for Town of Wappinger Supervisor. I am looking forward to continuing our work in improving the quality of life of those who live here.

As a member of the Dutchess County Legislature, I am proud of all that we have accomplished so far including returning \$1,259,979 to projects and organizations here in the Town of Wappinger. Following, I continue to address questions raised by new and existing Town residents. In this column, I focus on answering a question related to our law enforcement services.

I understand that the Town of Wappinger does not have its own police department. Who provides those services? You are correct, the Town does not have a police department. Our safety and security services are covered fundamentally by three law enforcement agencies:

- **The Dutchess County Sheriff's Department** – commencing a number of years ago, the Town Board decided to take a multi-pronged approach to provide law enforcement services to our 28 square mile community. First and primary has been to contract annually with the Sheriff's Department (845-486-3800). Sheriff's Deputies provide daily direct services in two own-owned and marked Wappinger Town Patrol Cars. Also, Sheriff Imperati makes available other officers to provide to Wappinger residents and organizations a wide range variety of services. Those services are covered in our annual budget. The sheriff's department operates a sub-station in Wappinger at the County Airport. For further information on the Sheriff's Department, please visit the Dutchess County Sheriff's Department website: www.dutchessny.gov/Departments/Sheriff/Dutchess-County-Sheriffs-Office.htm.

- **New York State Police, Troop K.** The Town of Wappinger is very fortunate to have a division of Troop K, servicing Zone 2, located in the Town's owned and maintained Emergency Services Building, located at 18 Middlebush Road (situate adjacent to Town Hall). A major focus of Troop K is "to make the state's

roads safer by reducing injuries, property damage and the loss of life caused by motor vehicle crashes." The State Police provide other services throughout the community and coordinate closely with the Sheriff's Department.

- **Wappingers Falls Police Department.** The Village of Wappingers Falls maintains a very active police department, located at 2628 South Avenue (845-297-1011). The Village maintains the budget and supervision of the WFPD which provides 24-7 services to the Village as well as contiguous areas to the Village. The WFPD works closely with the Sheriff's Department as well as the New York State Police: WWW.wappingersfallspolice.org.

Also, a Dutchess County agency assists in coordinating emergency responses.

- **Dutchess County Department of Emergency Response (DER).** The DER, a department of our Dutchess County Government supports Wappinger and other Dutchess County municipalities and first responders "in preparing for and responding to emergencies" in Wappinger and other communities. The DER is located at 392 Creek Road in Poughkeepsie, 845-486-2080. The DER oversees the county's 9-1-1 Emergency Communications Center which handles your "9-1-1" calls and coordinates EMS, fire and police agency responses. We are very fortunate that the Town's Ward 1 Councilman and our Deputy Supervisor, William "Bill" Beale, is Director of Emergency Management for Dutchess County.

Dangers of radon – What's your level?

It's a greater concern than lead, asbestos, formaldehyde and mold combined. It's a tasteless, odorless, colorless, inert, radioactive gas that is the second leading cause of lung cancer. Radon is a Class A - carcinogen and is hazardous to inhale, according to the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP) and Center of Disease Control (CDC).

Every home has it but, the question is "Do you have an elevated radon gas level in your home?" In your lifetime, you will be exposed to more radiation from radon in your home, approximately 55 percent, than any other source of radiation exposure, per the CDC.

• Where does radon come from? Radon occurs naturally from the breakdown of Uranium ore, and is prevalent in the Hudson Valley region. Elevated radon levels in indoor air usually come from the soil and building materials underneath the home. As Uranium breaks down, radon gas forms and seeps into the house through numerous possible entry points.

Radon from soil can get into any type of building, home, office, and school (old and new) - and can build up to higher levels in the air inside the structure. In addition, radon gas from well water can be a contributing factor to the overall air concentration and has its own individual health concern due to digestion. Radon in water should be tested as a possible independent source if you have a private well.

Every home has radon. There is no such thing as a home or building without Radon. The question is how high is your Radon level? The only way to know about radon levels is to conduct a certified test.

In the Hudson Valley and neighboring counties, individual's homes have approximately a 50 percent chance or greater of having elevated radon levels in their home. The EPA and the NYSDOH have published maps that identified what is known as the Red Zone. Zone 1 has a predicted average indoor, radon in air average, greater than 4.0 pCi/L. Dutchess, Orange, Putnam, Ulster, Columbia and Green Counties are listed in Zone 1.

• Why is radon a health concern? Radon in Soil - Breathing radon in indoor air can cause lung cancer. As the Uranium in the soil breaks down the byproduct is Radon gas and decays into radioactive particles that can get trapped in your lungs when you breathe it. As the particles break down, these particles release small bursts of energy.

This energy can damage lung tissue and increase your chances of developing lung cancer over the course of your lifetime. People who smoke have an even greater risk.

• Radon in Water - Radon in the air can also come from drinking water. Radon gas can dissolve and accumulate in water from underground sources such as, ground water, aquifers and private wells.

When water that contains radon is used in the home for showering, washing dishes, and cooking, radon gas escapes from the water and goes into the air and some could stay in the water. If some radon stays in the water, the drinking water containing radon also presents a health risk of developing internal organ cancers, primarily stomach cancer. If you have a private well and your source of water is from the ground and aquifer, is it strongly suggested to test for radon in your water to ensure there is no elevated level present for concern.

• Why should you test? Radon generally enters a home through soil, seeping upward into the foundation, in the basement and other living levels. Health risks increase with long-term exposure of elevated levels of radon. In fact, the U.S. Surgeon General has warned that radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the U.S. today. "Radon is the #1 cause of lung cancer for non - smokers and only smoking causes more lung cancer deaths." According to the CDC, radon is a Class A - carcinogen and is hazardous to inhale. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Surgeon General recommend testing all levels below the third floor for radon.

As a home or business owner, you can't afford not to test for radon. Testing is the only way to know if you and your family, friends, employees or tenants are exposed to harmful levels and at risk from radon gas.

Office for the Aging begins 'Friendly Calls' Program to promote senior socialization

The Dutchess County Office for the Aging (OFA) has begun a pilot "Friendly Calls" program to alleviate the feelings of loneliness and isolation some seniors feel. "Friendly Calls" connects these older adults with volunteers who call them weekly, speaking for 20-30 minutes and providing all-important social interaction, helping OFA achieve its mission of helping older adults remain active, age with dignity and live independently as long as possible.

An adaptation of the New York State Office for the Aging's "Friendly Calls" service, the County program has already trained two dozen volunteers to connect with local, pre-screened older adults who have identified an interest in fostering connections with others and reducing social isolation through weekly telephone conversations that cultivate relationships between participants. Nearly 40 local seniors who already receive services, case management and/or home-delivered meals from the Dutchess County OFA, have registered to be part of the program, having been surveyed to determine their level of loneliness and interest in participating.

Volunteer callers, many of whom already donate their time and talents to with other OFA programs, are similarly eager to participate and improve the mental and physical health of the older adults they call. The program runs in eight-week periods, and following an initial introductory conversation, volunteers will spend 20-30 minutes each week talking with the older adults with whom they're matched, based on mutual interest. If both participants express interest, they can extend their calls past the initial eight weeks.

County Executive William F.X. O'Neil said, "The safety and well-being of Dutchess County's older adults is a top priority, and we know feeling isolated can have adverse effects on a senior's physical health, including higher risk for high blood pressure, heart disease, obesity and dementia. Our Office for the Aging has begun its 'Friendly Calls' program to increase socialization for older adults

who need it and decrease those adverse effects related to loneliness. We look forward to expanding this program, based on its anticipated success, and enhancing as many Dutchess County seniors' lives as possible."

"Friendly Calls" volunteers report to an OFA Program Manager, designated to oversee the operation of the program. To qualify for the program, prospective volunteers must be:

- at least 18 years old;
- an active listener, a good conversationalist and able to speak clearly and slowly, if needed; and
- interested in meeting a new friend and open to hearing new ideas.

Training includes teaching volunteers conversation starters, meaningful and appropriate topics, active listening, problem-solving guidance and how to respect boundaries, among other topics. Volunteers can speak with as few or as many older adults they feel comfortable handling. The OFA's next volunteer orientation takes place on Feb. 9th; space is limited and residents interested in volunteering for the "Friendly Calls" program can contact OFA at 845-486-2555 to learn more.

Dutchess County OFA Director Todd Tancredi said, "Following her years as an advocate for older adults on the State Senate's Aging Committee, Sue Serino recommended the 'Friendly Calls' program for Dutchess County seniors, and we enthusiastically implemented it. Both our volunteers and the seniors they call are anxious to foster relationships that will be mutually beneficial."

"Friendly Calls" was a 2023 budget initiative for the County's OFA, which has expanded its services since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic to create innovative offerings – including drive-through picnics, drive-in Bingo games, Pancakes in the Park and virtual exercise programs, among others – which allowed the seniors it serves to regain the socialization that plays an important role in enhancing the quality of life.

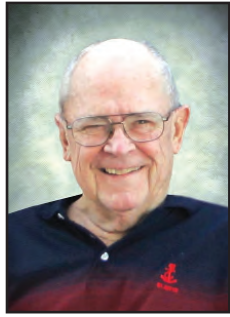

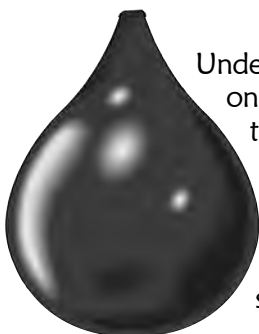

A time to reflect and readjust...

Maybe it's because it happens to us gradually but, for me at least, it's hard to believe I'm not twenty anymore. And although this is an ongoing challenge that's far from over, there's finally light at the end of the tunnel. Change is coming and change is good.

My last article was yet another illustration of this. A kind and lovely reader of this column reached out to ask some very necessary questions due to my lack of clarity. In short, the article and subsequent recipe were poorly written (my words, not hers). All of her points were not just valid but eye-opening. I had written a confusing recipe that left her baffled and, although it was upsetting to know I had dropped the ball, I greatly appreciate her taking the time to call me out, which she did kindly and perfectly. They say bad things come in threes and at the time I wrote that article that rule of three was in full swing. I was overwhelmed by events I couldn't change but, once again, thought I had a handle on. Maybe I could be forgiven for any stubbornness on my part to continue on as if things were just peachy. Maybe my state of mind is just making all of this more

dramatic than it is. Maybe none of you even noticed. But I did and am working hard to fix it. Thanks to being shown I need to do better, I'm taking steps that have clarity coming back and I'm beginning to feel more like me. I have a ways to go before I can even get close to my best self, and I may never get there or it may already have passed, but I'm optimistic that I'm finally on a good path and the long road is looking shorter, sunnier and less rocky every day.

And, no, one badly written article didn't make this happen. I found it hard to cut myself any slack even though I knew I was far from fine. Others are far worse off so just deal with it. I respect the sometimes crippling difficulty, understand how it feels to weep all day and feel worthless. It isn't easy to reach out for help, let alone go it alone, but DO get help. It's so worth it. You are worth it.

A heavy article this time, I know, but it felt necessary and I thank you for your time and indulgence. And although tears are coming as I close this, they're from a better, more hopeful place. I humbly apologize to my family, friends, coworkers, editors and readers for straying so far and thank you all for your patience and understanding. This will be a great year and I look forward to cooking, writing, rediscovering passion, loving - and living - my beautiful life and making the most of all I have. Humble pie isn't bad, especially when it makes you stronger and helps you find yourself along the way. And now that my glass is once again half full - cheers!

The Wild Garden, Part Two

In praise of a more natural-looking garden

“The Wild Garden,” William Robinson’s broadside against the formal gardening traditions of mid-19th century England, resonates today as a blueprint for modern ecological gardening and landscaping design. While I was researching the Wild Garden Project under way at the Beatrix Farrand Garden at Bellefield, everyone I met, including horticulturist Karen Waltuch, was astonished that I had not read the book. (F.Y.I. I have read a few books over the years.) So, I got a copy from the library and read it.

“The Wild Garden” was published in 1870 by then 35-year-old gardener William Robinson, who was already an expert in garden design, having traveled worldwide, even to the American southwest, from his native Ireland. The gardening style of the day involved large formal flower beds, borders arranged in geometrical designs, and tender annuals that needed to be dug up and replanted every season. Robinson’s system of “Wild Gardening” relied on hardy perennial flowers that would require minimal care, arranged in their natural settings. Think of daffodils naturalized to bloom at the edge of a woods in early spring. “My object in the Wild Garden,” the author writes, “is to show how we may have more of the varied beauty of hardy flowers than the most ardent admirer of the old style of gardens (massive beds of annual flowers) ever dreams of, by naturalizing many beautiful plants of many regions of the earth in our fields, woods and outer parts of the pleasure grounds, and in neglected places

in almost every kind of garden.” Note that Robinson was not restricting us to native wildflowers, or even wildflowers in general. In his chapter entitled “Hardy Exotic Flowering Plants for the Wild Garden” he lists alliums, cyclamen, yucca, even Japanese Knotweed! He also advocates for big, bold natives like goldenrod and joe pye weed, which are the opposite of bedding plants.

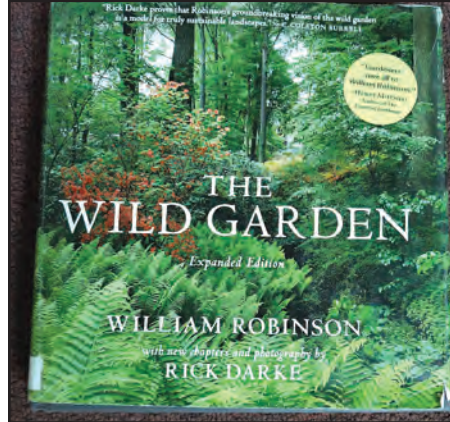
Hudson Valley gardeners will recall that Robinson’s ideas were not totally novel – our own Andrew Jackson Downing, and before him Dr. Samuel Bard of Hyde Park, practiced the romantic style of gardening as a reaction to neoclassical designs of the 18th century. You can still see a Downing landscape at Springside on Academy Street, Poughkeepsie.

Evidently, landscape gardener Beatrix Farrand was a Robinson devotee. She designed a wild garden at Bellefield, the home of State Senator Thomas Newbold, and the future home of the Beatrix Farrand Garden Association, on the grounds of the F.D. Roosevelt National Historic site in Hyde Park.

Farrand’s “wild garden” was never built, until now. The Wild Garden Project at Bellefield is under way.

I’m sure William Robinson, Beatrix Farrand and maybe even Andrew Jackson Downing, would be proud.

Robinson’s ideas still resonate today. A generation ago, huge beds of annual flowers, mainly impatiens and begonias, brightened (Robinson would have said “blighted”) the campuses of corporate

headquarters. Nowadays those displays have been replaced by gardens of native grasses and hardy perennials, saving labor and energy.

The edition of “The Wild Garden” I got from the library is a new expanded volume published in 2009 with extra chapters, photos and introductions by land-

scape designer Rick Darke.

It’s a beautiful book. I’m returning it tomorrow.
